This is a documented narrative of a premonition that occurred in The Bolton/Friendship Community
As passed down to Vermell by her mother Minnie "Tidwell" Jones

Emmett Jones was a native of Bolton/Friendship, born in 1878. He married Minnie Tidwell in 1924. In 1928 Minnie and Emmett had been married four years and enjoying three children of their final count of four. Only three years separated Jess Willard, the first born and baby Vermell. Emmett's Father Jim had passed on and his Mother Nancy was a member of the household. She was assisting with the care of her grand children. Jeff Huff's daughter Verna was living down the road in the next house. Verna was married to Willie Avery and had seven children ranging in age from 3 to 14. Verna was 33 in age and still a beautiful lady by any standards. One afternoon Minnie was washing clothes at the well which was located away from the house but still within the picket fence of the yard. While engaged in doing her wash she was bestowed with an unexplained gift still talked about in modern times. She looked up from her washing and saw Verna walking up to the picket fence gate. Verna was dressed in a black skirt and white blouse with her beautiful dark hair pulled back. Minnie told her to go around to the back door and go on in the house, informing her that Grandma Nancy was inside with the children and she would join them shortly. In the time span of a moment, Minnie turned around, wiped her hands on her apron, turned back around and Verna had disappeared. Repetitiously in the evening Minnie and Emmett would set on the porch and enjoy the cool night air. This would be after Grandma and the children were in bed.
