

Notes for ALEXANDER MCANULTY:

Francis Alaxender was a Confederate Soldier in the Civil War. He was assigned to the 2nd Regiment of the Florida Infantry. The 2nd participated in the Battle of Williamsburg, Seven Day's Battle at Cold Harbor, Petersburg Siege, Appomattox, Gettysburg and others. In some of the battles more than 40 percent of the 2nd Infantry's soldiers were casualties.



Alexander and his brother John Wesley were two of the original appointed trustees of Collins Church and Cemetery. Plantation owner David Collins donated his family church and cemetery to the community in 1876.

 Jackson County Know all men by these presents, that David Collins of the County and State above mentioned, do hereby grant, bargain and convey unto John M. Anselty, A. M. Anselty, L. B. Knowles, John Mathias, George Whitfield, W. W. Knowles, W. R. Talley, Trustees for Collins Chapel, two acres of land upon which is situated a brick building situated on the South East corner of the South East quarter of the South East quarter of Section 36, Township 7, Range 9, Town and to hold as the property of the M. E. Church, South.
