Notes for HAMILTON D. PYNES:

Memorandum for Lt. Col. Oates A. Pynes concerning Private Hamilton D. Pynes: Hamilton D. Pynes was mustered into Capt. A.G. Brown's Company (Brown Rebels), 18 Reg't Mississippi Volunteers, at Corinth, Mississippi, on June 4, 1861. He was 23 years of age, joined for twelve (12) months, and traveled 375 miles to the place of rendezvous. He died of illness in Leesburg, Virginia, on September 12, 1861. The disease was typhoid fever and another date is given for his death, September 11, 1861. From the records of: "Company H. (Brown Rebels), 18 Regiment Mississippi Infantry", April 29, 1861 to February 27, 1865, shows that H.D. Pynes enlisted on April 29, 1861, at Terry, Mississippi, for one year. He was born in Alabama, was a farmer, the nearest post office to his residence was Terry, Mississippi. He was 24 years of age when he enlisted, he was single, and he "Died from Sickness" at Leesburg Virginia October 5, 1861. Hamilton was buried in a mass grave with other soldiers at Union Cemetery in Leesburg, Virginia. His Civil War marker was delivered to the Pleasant Hill Cemetery in Houston County, Alabama and placed by the grave of his parents.
