Notes for WILLIAM J. LOCKART:

William J. Lockart died in 1903 and was buried in Glover Family Cemetery. Glover is located in the extreme northeast corner of Jackson County, Florida near the Alabama and Georgia State Lines. A survey in 1956 indicated only seven markers with the first in 1867 and the last interment in 1917. The seven names on the survey were: four Glover's, one Cook, one Skipper and W.J. Lockart. Perhaps the geographical factor was instrumental in burying W.J. Lockart in the Glover cemetery. Census of 1900 indicate he lived in precinct 11 (Neals Landing) which is the same general area as the cemetery. Glover followed the trend of most isolated cemeteries and became abandon in the second half of the century (and perhaps before). William remained there for almost a century. Then in October 1984 Franklin Eugene Ducker (a great-great grandson) located and visited his grave. He was sadden by the isolation and desertion of his ancestral grandfather. Eugene stood up to the plate and took action to correct it. After a considerable amount of work and time he cleared all legal obstacles with both states and on November 24, 1984 had his remains exhumed and relocated. His remains were again interned to join other family members in this Antioch Cemetery.
